The first webinar in the three-part series, Building Resilient Systems Towards Cervical Cancer Elimination, will provide a pan North American view of the response to the call to eliminate cervical cancer as a public health concern and being the first of our deep dives into each of the three-prongs of the World Health Organization global strategy, beginning with pillar three - achieving 90% of people with cervical disease receive treatment. Part 1 of the webinar will provide a snapshot of progress to date, share keen insights and narrow in on elimination planning in Canada and the United States. The second part of the webinar will include discussions about treatment, pathways to ensure early detection and translation to cure, and the skillsets required and the building of community trust in the health system for boosting demand for prevention as well as patient-centered care and models for palliative care.

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
